The 2022-2023 NFHCA Annual Report highlights a year of remarkable achievements and contributions within the field hockey community. With nearly 1,400 members representing all levels of the game, the NFHCA continues to thrive and impact the sport on a national scale.

I'd like to acknowledge the invaluable contributions of the 225 dedicated committee members and 16 board members whose commitment and efforts continue to advance the Association's mission.

A standout moment this past year was the induction of the 22nd NFHCA Hall of Fame Class and Lifetime Achievement Award recipients, a ceremony at the NFHCA Annual Convention that honored exemplary individuals who have left an indelible mark on the sport.

The year celebrated coaching milestones, with acknowledgments for our newest Victory Club members and Collegiate Coaching Staffs of the Year. Additionally, the Junior Hockey Award, DEI Spotlight Recognition, and President's Service Award were presented to deserving individuals and groups. The NFHCA bestowed nearly 6,600 athletic and academic awards upon high school and collegiate student-athletes.

The NFHCA's commitment to inspiring excellence was exemplified through Ready2Coach clinics, virtual Coaches Corners, and the Annual Convention, benefitting over 600 participants. The Campfire Mentoring Program connected 71 coaches across 18 different Campfire groups.

Strategic collaborations with USA Field Hockey further underscores the NFHCA's dedication to promoting our sport and expanding our community. The inception of the *Field Hockey Forward* initiative, aimed at expanding the footprint of collegiate field hockey, emerged from the larger strategic alliance cultivated with USA Field Hockey.





OUR COMMUNITY CELEBRATING PLAYERS

During the 2022 NCAA Championship weekend for their respective divisions, **106 selected seniors** were celebrated in the NFHCA Senior Game. This marked their final appearance in their team uniforms, with matches taking place at the various divisional championship venues.



Nearly **6,600 high school and collegiate student-athletes**, along with **110 collegiate teams**, were acknowledged through the NFHCA's five distinct Academic Awards Programs.





254 collegiate student-athletes were nominated by their coaches for the inaugural NFHCA Watchlist.

176 student-athletes were named to the 2022 NFHCA All-American Team.



INSPIRING EXCELLENCE COACHING EDUCATION



85 coaches attended one of six clinics offered from July 2022 through June 2023 across five regional locations. An additional **300+** coaches attended the Ready2Coach sessions hosted at the 2023 NFHCA Annual Convention.

228 coaches attended virtual programming offered over eight hours of online sessions.

COACHES CORNER



18 new Campfire mentoring groups assembled in March 2023 with **71** mentor and mentee participants.

While two grant recipients completed their mentoring through the inaugural Redwood Grant program of last year, two additional recipients were awarded the grant in the spring of 2023. Danielle Baumgardner, founder of The Collab and Katie Clark, co-owner of Rocky Mountain Field Hockey Club will each receive \$2,500 each over the next year, along with mentoring to support their work.



"The Redwood Grant allowed us to hire summer interns. Our interns helped develop our understanding of the youth sports landscape in the region, helped connect us with field hockey clubs and programs throughout the region, and created programs and communicated with new areas on our behalf. INSPIRING EXCELLENCE ANNUAL CONVENTION



345 members and 29 exhibitors attended the January 2023 Convention in Lake Mary, Florida, which was headlined by a keynote conversation with fan favorites Julie Foudy and Marlene Bjornsrud. 16 attended the inaugural Assistant Coach Workshop offered as a pre-convention option for assistant and associate coaches.



105 teams and 1587 athletes competed at the 2023 Winter Escape Showcase, with over 200 college coaches in attendance during the three-day event in Sanford, Florida. 3Step Sports once again did a fantastic job of facilitating and operating this successful event.

The fifth-edition of the NFHCA Annual Salary Survey results was published in March 2023. Based on the data provided, average head coach salaries across divisions continued to increase year-over-year and key takeaways were highlighted to assist coaches in their salary negotiations.

A curated online guide for coaches brand-new to field hockey coaching was launched on the NFHCA website in August 2022. The kit focuses on basics such as technical skills, rules, and practice management.

A disability inclusive field hockey program, their mission is to help level the playing field for all by aiming to support their athletes both on and off the field.

COLLABORATIONSTRATEGIC ALLIANCES

Recognizing the necessity to collaborate, **USA Field Hockey and the NFHCA** joined forces in December 2022 to establish a strategic alliance with the two main areas of focus as follows:

- 1 Advancing the professional development, support, and recognition of coaches.
- 2 Advocating for the preservation and expansion of field hockey in the U.S.

Recognizing the important areas of need to collaborate for the preservation, sustainability, and growth of our sport, both organizations believe there are mutual benefits to be achieved by working together.

The primary objectives of this alliance include:

- Understanding and respecting our unique roles and responsibilities as stewards of our sport in the U.S.
- Exploring the synergies and efficiencies which can be achieved by working together
- Identifying and collaborating on joint projects that fulfill our stated objectives
- Marketing and promoting one another's top initiatives where no overlap exists, and where existing individual organizational contractual obligations permit.

As a result of this alliance, the following initiatives have been achieved thus far:

- The Field Hockey Forward (FHF) initiative, dedicated to championing the growth and inclusion of women's field hockey at the collegiate level. FHF is committed to increasing the visibility and footprint of NCAA field hockey.
- USA Field Hockey Level 1 & 2 Certification Clinics in tandem with regional NFHCA Ready2Coach events and the Annual Convention.
- Promoting and amplifying coach education information, USWNT noteworthy news, and other relevant news with one another's membership.











2022-2023 Net Revenue: \$30,032
