

**94** coaches attended one of five clinics offered from July 2023 through June 2024 across five regional locations. An additional **300+** coaches attended the Ready2Coach sessions hosted at the 2024 NFHCA Annual Convention.

**314** attendees engaged in virtual professional development programming offered over 12 hours of online sessions.

### **COACHES CORNER**



**18** new Campfire mentoring groups assembled in March 2024 with **80** mentor and mentee participants.

In 2023, Redwood Grant recipients Danielle Baumgardner and Katie Clark made strides in advancing field hockey. Danielle used the grant to further develop The Collab, a program offering mentorship and training for athletes and their families. Katie, co-owner of Rocky Mountain Field Hockey Club, expanded her club by adding coaches, new equipment, and introducing indoor field hockey. Both highlighted the critical role of mentorship and community support in their success.





The inaugural Aspire Coaches Academy, launched in March 2024, and sponsored by ZAG Tours, welcomed 12 assistant collegiate coaches for a nine-month program focused on professional growth and leadership development. Through virtual labs and in-participants have engaged in refining and enhancing their coaching and leadership skills. This initiative has set the foundation for future academies, helping coaches elevate their careers and impact within the field hockey community.




## INSPIRING EXCELLENCE TOOLS & RESOURCES








# **OUR VOICE**BRAND & REACH

## **COLLABORATION**STRATEGIC ALLIANCES







The <u>Field Hockey Forward</u> initiative, a collaborative effort between USA Field Hockey and the NFHCA as part of the strategic alliance developed in 2022, made positive progress in 2023-2024. Advisory Committees across all collegiate divisions were assembled to guide efforts, and **20** pitch meetings were conducted with schools and conferences to grow the sport at the collegiate level.

To boost visibility and awareness of the benefits of field hockey sport sponsorship, four digital newsletters were sent to over 1,800 NCAA athletic leaders, keeping field hockey top of mind for athletic departments nationwide.



Embracing its status as the third most popular sport worldwide, field hockey holds a significant position among NCAA women's sports, with <u>nearly 300 institutions</u> actively participating and its influence on the rise.


## **COLLABORATION**STRATEGIC ALLIANCES

### **Sports**Recruits



The NFHCARecruits partnership with SportsRecruits continues to drive impactful results, enhancing recruitment opportunities for field hockey athletes. Over the past year, the NFHCA Winter Escape Showcase saw 348 coaches from 214 programs generate 10,250 evaluations of 1,186 unique athletes.

From July 1, 2023 to June 30, 2024, NFHCARecruits tracked nearly 25,000 evaluations across 18 events, with 89 percent of participating colleges using Event Beacon to scout potential recruits. This partnership remains a helpful tool in connecting athletes with collegiate programs.











